

## PLURAL POSSESSIVE PRONOUN PREFIXES AND KINSHIP TERMS

In the following table, we add the distributive plural prefix **daa-** to non-singular pronoun prefixes. Adding **daa-** to such prefixes makes it clear that one is talking about more than two people whose relative it is. **daanahi-** (or **daanai-**) means, "our<sup>>2</sup>, your<sup>>2</sup>." **daagúbi-** (or **daagúi-**) means, "their<sup>>2</sup>." And, **daagu-** means "people's<sup>>2</sup>." We do not include such forms for all relatives. We provide examples to which readers may add.
